ARE YOU AWARE...

- That Griffons need lots of exercise to keep them happy?
- That Griffons need periodic grooming to prevent matting, and some require ear hair plucking?
- That even with regular grooming, you will always have some dog hair on your clothing and/or furniture?
- That Griffons do shed and are not considered a hypoallergenic dog?
- That Griffons mature slowly, and some are hard to house train?
- That Griffon puppies have a lot of energy and unless that energy is discharged through activity and interaction, they can become destructive?
- That Griffons require a great deal of your time and attention daily?
- That some Griffons have a real need and desire to carry things in their mouths; therefore, they will carry/chew and/or swallow whatever you leave on the floor?
- That they need the company and companionship of people and are happiest when they are with people? They were developed as a breed to have this characteristic.
- That even though the breed is noted for being good with children, they should not be left unsupervised with small children?
- That even though the breed is noted as people-loving dogs, they are still dogs and behave like dogs?
- That even though the breed is known for being well behaved and intelligent, good behavior from a Griffon requires training on your part?
- That Griffons are a soft breed and as such do not respond well to harsh training methods and that they respond best to gentle consistent methods and calm voices.
- That some Griffons can be quite stubborn?
- That Griffons learn by repetition, so it is very important to be consistent when training?
- That all puppies are sold with nonbreeding rights unless otherwise agreed upon in advance.
